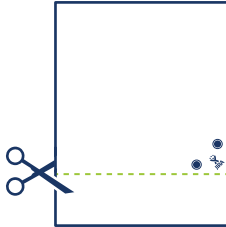

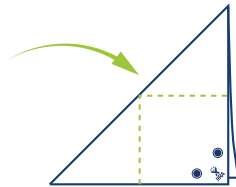

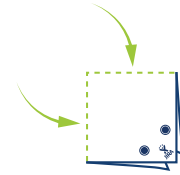
Cut off the excess paper as shown. The print side should be facing up with the **JIRA logo on the lower right corner**. Keep in mind—this is the easiest step so if you screw it up, you may want to find a friend to help you out with the rest.

Take the top left corner and **fold it back behind the piece** to match up with the lower right corner. Now you should have a triangle and the JIRA logo should still be on the lower right.

Take both the top corner and the left corner and fold them back behind the piece to once again **match up with the lower right corner**. You should be left with a square again, only smaller (no, it's not magic—just origami).

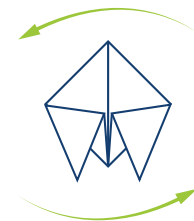
Ok, now **flip it over**. If you'd like this step to be more exciting, feel free to let out your best war cry.

**Fold the two pieces as shown** along the line labeled "Step 5". These are the wings, so try to fold them as aerodynamically as possible.

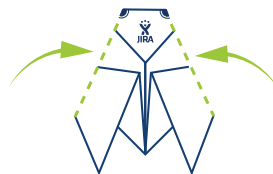
**Rotate** the piece as shown.

**Fold the top down** along the dotted line (yes, fold both pieces of paper). At this point, you should once again see the JIRA logo and the bug's little beady eyes.

Now fold the wings back as shown in the diagram. The top of the fold should intersect with the bug's eyes. If you'd like a guide, **flip the piece over and you'll see a dotted line** there to help you.

That's it! Pretty **easy**, right?

Pin that thing to your wall and watch the accolades roll in for your sweet origami skills!
