How to Use Your Deck: Readings

To gain career insights from the Work Life Tarot Deck, different configurations of cards will aid and guide your reading of them.

It can be as simple as pulling one from the deck for a daily check-in, or sitting down for a five-card spread that dives deeper into a problem or a pivot you're considering.

If you're familiar with tarot or have your own practice, feel free to bring it to this deck. Otherwise, below are a range of readings to explore as you get started. No matter which you choose, approach the deck with an open mind. Before you pull cards, center something you're dealing with at work or in your career. Shuffle your deck until you feel your intention is clear. Every reading will be different, but keep an ear out for themes that span multiple sessions.



Stand-Up Pull

1 Card

Only have a minute? Focus on one question, obstacle, or something you need a new perspective on.

Pull one card to add context.

Do this daily or whenever you want to rethink something.



This or That Spread

2 Cards

When you're deciding between two options, examine your dueling paths with a little help from the deck.

Pull two cards and place them facedown, side by side, each corresponding to a different choice.

Then, flip them over to view each option through a new lens.



Then, Now, Next Spread

3 Cards

This simple-yet-revealing card spread helps you take a look back, consider where you are now, and think ahead. This is an ideal spread for when you're at an inflection point in your work or career, or need a push to think through one issue's multiple sides.

Pull three cards and put them face down in a line:

- Flip the card on the left, which represents the past.
- Turn over the card in the middle to reflect on what's happening now.
- End with the card on the right to consider what's coming next.

In a three-card spread, you can apply different meanings to what you pull:

- Rose, bud, thorn
- What you think, what you feel, how you act
- Your present situation, how you want it to change, steps you can take toward it



The 4Ls Spread

4 Cards

The original [4Ls Play](#) was designed as a retrospective, but you can apply the framework to something you're currently dealing with or even a future project.

With the project or situation that you want to examine in mind, pull four cards and arrange them facedown in an L shape. Start with the card on the top left and work down then over.

Top Left Card (Love):

This card represents what went or is going well, and may help you locate a silver lining.

Card Below (Loathe):

Revealing the thorn in this project's side, this card can shed light on what could be improved.

Card to the Right (Longing):

Flip to take a closer look at what's lacking and maybe even where to replenish it.

Bottom Right Card (Learning):

This last card reveals your greatest takeaway from this – perhaps you've yet to learn.



The 5 Ws Spread

5 Cards

Start with a problem in mind, and deal five cards face down in a diamond with one card in the middle.

Flip over the card at the top of your diamond.
This is your North Star, representing the greater issue you're digging into and asking you the first "W," or **why it happened**.

Move clockwise around your diamond, flipping over the card on the right. This asks **what caused the issue**.

The card at the bottom of your diamond asks you **what decisions** led to it.

The last point in your diamond asks you to consider **what conditions** allowed for or even encouraged the situation.

You've examined why and what, now it's time to think through the solutions to the problem that you started with. Flip over the final card at the center and see **what it reveals**.





Major Arcana

Representing major milestones, tentpole moments, and life's biggest questions





The Founder

The Founder is a powerful card, asking you to show up for yourself and reminding you that you absolutely can. Channel your knowledge, skills, and strength to act on your purpose. Find the learnings in your wins, and the wins within your perceived failures. Embrace what you have to offer and what you've been through – it's all part of your unique story.

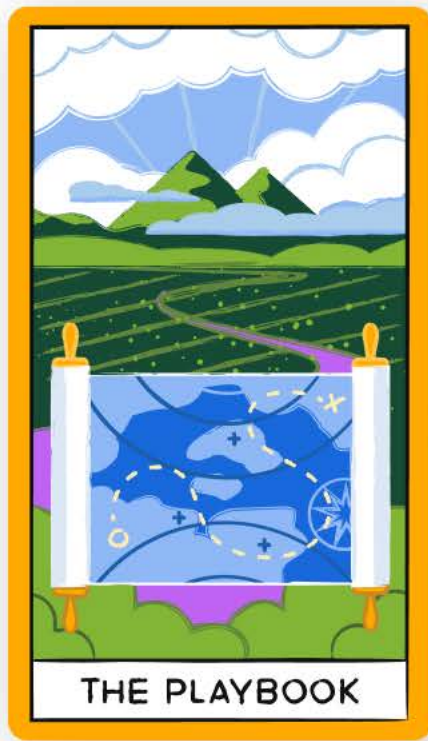
This card may signify the beginning of something, or be a sign that it's time to start that thing – a conversation, a company, or even a movement. Put humility on pause and move forward with the mindset, "what can't I do?"

The Work Bestie

When you can't find the answer in you, look for it in a Slack with your best work bud or a sparring session with a trusted team. Even if you prefer the IC life, [relationships at work are crucial to happiness](#), so take this opportunity to reflect on how others show up in your day.

Who can you confide in? Delegate to? Or create something entirely new with? Are you showing up for others in your work-life? If no one comes to mind as the other half to your BFF badge, look around for folks that'd be fun to form a flock with at the water cooler. With a Work Bestie or two on tap, the sky's the limit.





The Playbook

Both practical and romantic, The Playbook keeps our eyes on the prize and reminds us of the resources in reach to win it. It encourages us to celebrate the journey and its destination – to cheers teammates on a hard-won success, or figure out how to arrive at one.

Just like neglected texts that need your response, unroll whatever scroll you've been carrying around unopened. Perhaps it's a to-do list, instructions, or a map with the very steps to the treasure you're seeking. Tap tools and teammates to help you find the right way forward. And if still stuck, [look here](#).

The Promotion

You're being called to the next step up in your journey. Sometimes the Promotion is literal, other times it arrives to expose a project, conversation, or personal matter that needs to move forward.

What do you see at the top of the stairs? Let this card remind you of your strength as you prepare for the climb. Be courageous and channel your powers of persuasion, even if the person you need to influence most is yourself.





THE EXTROVERT

The Extrovert

The Extrovert is a social butterfly that does their best work in community with others. They pollinate more than just office gossip in their huddles, but new ways of thinking that can bloom into real action plans.

Could your own work be energized by sharing it with teammates? Sometimes just being out and about or coming into the office can light a fire you haven't been able to spark solo. When looking for answers, ask yourself: What can I learn from those around me?

The Introvert

While seemingly more reserved than their colorful counterparts, the Introvert knows and shows that there's beauty in the unknown and often in solitude where answers become clear in the dark.

Quiet what you can to tune in to the truth. Read, reflect, and reach out to someone wiser than you on the topics you seek to learn more about. When looking for answers, don't forget to also ask yourself: What can I teach others?



THE INTROVERT



Out of Office

Vacation sounds nice, but before you set up that out-of-office email, ponder where you're going and what you're looking forward to leaving behind. This is a card of fortune and opportunity, so find it and take it, whether it involves hitting the slopes, hitting the stacks, or hitting pause.

If you can't take a sabbatical right now, explore what you can take time off from. If you find yourself envious of the "you" you get to be on vacation, decide how to bring a souvenir of that self into the timeline you're living in now.

Work Life

When presented with Work Life, you're being asked to assess the balance between your wants and needs, what you think and what you feel, or to weigh your professional and personal interests.

Try to actually visualize those last two as a scale – do you see "work and life" or "work vs life" for you? Consider what you could move or lose altogether to stop those scales from tipping. You may need to make some hard choices to strike the balance you desire.





404 Error

It's totally normal to feel frustration or fear when faced with a 404 Error, but the message isn't always ominous. Mistakes happen, including ones that cause complete system shutdowns. But fixing them might be as simple as hitting "refresh."

Think about what in your life needs a reboot, and don't be afraid to pull the plug on anything that keeps giving you an error message. An end, while potentially daunting, makes way for new beginnings. Try to get excited for this one.

The Customer

It's easy to get wrapped up in the internal workings of a larger org or a major mission, but The Customer reminds you not to lose sight of the gems that matter on the other side.

Think outside the box of "me and we" and shift your focus to the "you" you're doing it all for. You may have to quiet the loudest voices to figure out which are the most important, but it'll be worth it to figure out which stones are worth your shine.





Free Snacks

A cornucopia of freshly stocked goodies overflows before you here, asking you to consider what's fueling your work, your drive, you. When Free Snacks appear in front of you it's not only time to treat yourself, but get the nourishment you're missing.

Where in your work or life are you hungry for nutrients, and where are you sated? No matter what you're craving, remember that there is an abundance around you, ripe for the picking if only you can approach life as the endless buffet that office lunches are.

The Offsite

The most rewarding travel card in the universe is telling you it's time to take a trip. The world is big, but the literal distance you need to go to shift your outlook on it could be a conference room one floor away. Move your desk at home. Hole up in a cafe one morning a week. Gather for Taco Tuesday.

Whatever steps or modes of transportation you take to get there, consider what comes out of a successful offsite: Deeper connections, fresh solutions, and hopefully, fun. Channel those now and rethink what upgrades you need to make them your final destination.

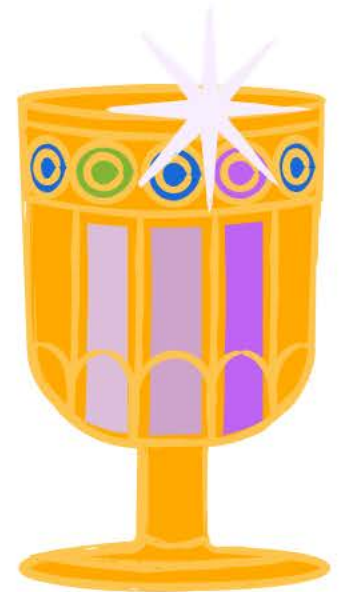
Minor Arcana

Representing daily happenings, recurring and smaller questions
– which don't always feel small in the moment.

Cups

The water suit

The Cups suit signifies fluidity, heart, and emotions. If this suit spills into your readings, it may be drawing attention to relationships in your life, encouraging you to listen to your intuition, or asking what you're feeling.





Ace of Cups

Seize this card as a fresh start, a cup filled to the brim, opportunities dancing near the surface like ice cubes in fizzy water. Notice that your glass is clear. Similarly, you have an unobscured view into what's right for you.

See yourself and your options for what you know them to be – and you do know. Your intuition is like an automatic faucet, so stick your hands out and receive the info.

Ready for a refill? The Ace of Cups may signal a new social interactions ahead, so leave your AirPods at your desk when you head back to the kitchen.

Two of Cups

You need a thought partner to caffeinate the ideas you have percolating, a coffee mate who can stimulate you intellectually and emotionally.
Who can you invite to pull up a chair?

The Two of Cups has been known to play Cupid and could be doing so here, whether their aim is to connect you with someone or something, like the passion in your professional life. Whatever it is, take this as permission not to hold back on the feelings you have brewing.





Three of Cups

Happy hour is here, and you're invited to raise a glass and toast yourself and your team. Since teamwork makes the dream work, make sure everyone that pitched in was added to the invite. Start working up a toast that hat tips to the celebration at hand and the growth it took to get here.

Remember that happy hours happen for all kinds of reasons. They can be a quarterly routine to spark some fun, a party to mark another goal met, or a goodbye as one moves on to a new chapter. What's yours for?

Four of Cups

You've been heads down crushing your to-do list, and your cluttered workspace shows it. Your desk is stacked with various drinks, but you're somehow still parched. Time to investigate what will *really* quench your thirst.

Take stock of where you sit now, meditate on the moment, and look beyond your desk at what could be. To make room for what's being offered, you may need to set boundaries or say no. That's okay! You only have so much space.





Five of Cups

Good news: Something disappointing happened! Why good? Failure is not just a part of life, but can be hammered into a gleaming badge of honor, like how The Founder pivots their fails into teaching moments and the building blocks of new projects.

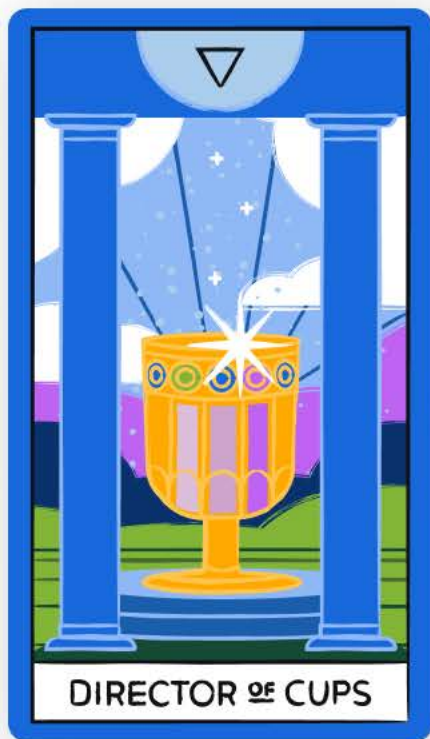
Feel what comes up while cleaning the spill of a substance that was admittedly past its expiration date. Accept what's next, whether a grieving period or an exciting breakthrough. And amidst the mess, don't miss out on the cup that's upright and waiting to receive.

Six of Cups

You're invited to cozy up in a warm blanket of nostalgia as the Six of Cups asks you to remember lessons learned in kindergarten and the creative fearlessness you so easily tapped into way back when.

What would 6-year-old you think about who you are today? Give all of the lives you've lived a lil' extra love, and find the silver lining in more recent "past lives," like former roles or workplaces. You can't actually go back and change course, but you can learn from what you've been through, or even revisit a path you've previously strayed from.





Director of Cups

A glorious goblet beckons you to take a gulp of what you already know to be true. The Director of Cups has found success embracing their intuition and encouraging others, like you in this moment, to do the same.

Take the bejeweled open mouth as a reminder that you don't have to put a lid on your emotions right now. Recognize and honor them, as The Director does with their own and those in their circle. When you trust your gut and feel your feels, as this suit rallies you to do, you can tap into your future and how to reach it.

Pens

The air suit

This suit can signal intellect, conflict, and the problem-solving necessary to get through it. A sometimes serious-seeming suit, the presence of Pens in your reading means you're being called to use a mighty tool: your brain.





Ace of Pens

While this suit encourages thought, the Ace of Pens reminds you to act. Think before you leap, then... leap! Notice that this pen is also a feather flying high. Take that as a promise that you won't fall when you do.

Maybe a recent leap has led to a breakthrough, or you're on the precipice of one. If nothing comes to mind, channel your critical thinking skills by examining other cards in your reading for more context. And don't forget to act on what you see.

Two of Pens

Two pens lay side-by-side, each on different papers representing your options. These are fancy pens, the kind that come from a store that pretty much only sells pens made for signing important documents. Like these.

While it appears you have a decision to make, maybe one you've been putting off, this card encourages you to stop and think first. Weigh your options. Read the docs, take notes, consult a trusted source. Don't force it! And consider what signing your name on the dotted line will mean.





Three of Pens

There's been a recent disappointment or betrayal, one that you haven't run from. Instead you confronted reality and have thought long and hard about what happened. Problem is, those thoughts are now consuming, not serving you.

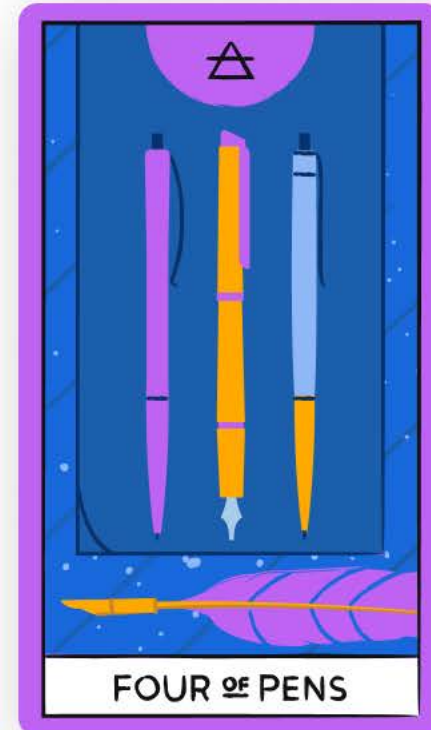
What's weighing on your mind right now? Is it preventing you from getting to the other side? It's time to shift your mindset and, with it, the bad vibes. This is a heavy warning, but one that gives you the opportunity to change course and stop overthinking before those thoughts drown you.

Four of Pens

If you were looking for a sign that you need a break, this is it. The Four of Pens is the burnout card telling you to sleep (and dream) to recover your intellectual power and sense of self. When you close your eyes, take note of what you see.

Don't be afraid to put the universe on Do Not Disturb – just set an alarm to eventually call you back into action.

If this card shows up during a time of conflict, it's encouraging you to surrender. Sometimes the big win is knowing when to end the fight.





Five of Pens

There's tension in the air and a conflict that only you can solve. You just need to think clearly enough to strategize on a solution that serves all sides, including yours.

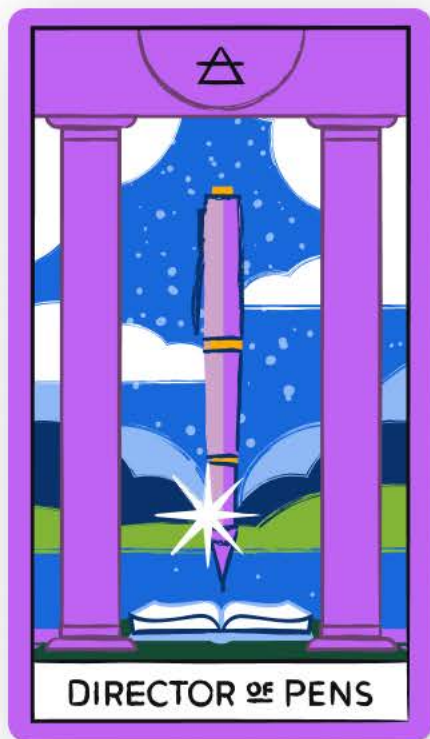

Director of Pens

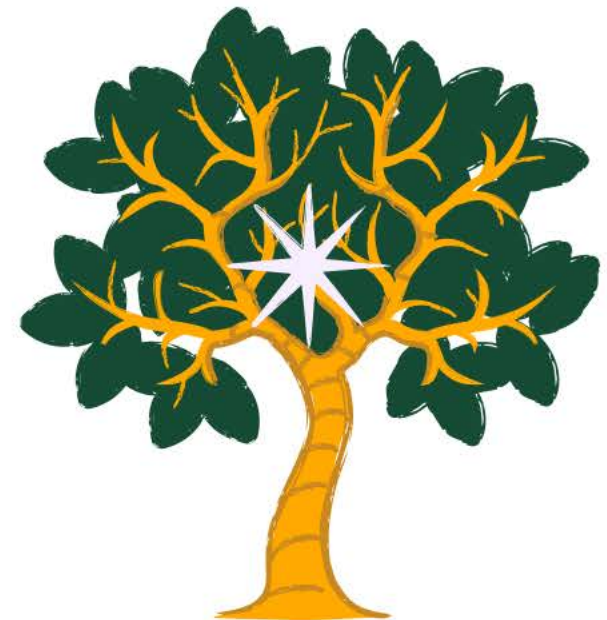
A teacher and a student, the Director of Pens is a thought leader whose wisdom is in knowing when to assume which role. They've been through it and have documented their many tales for others to learn from.

Ace of Leaves

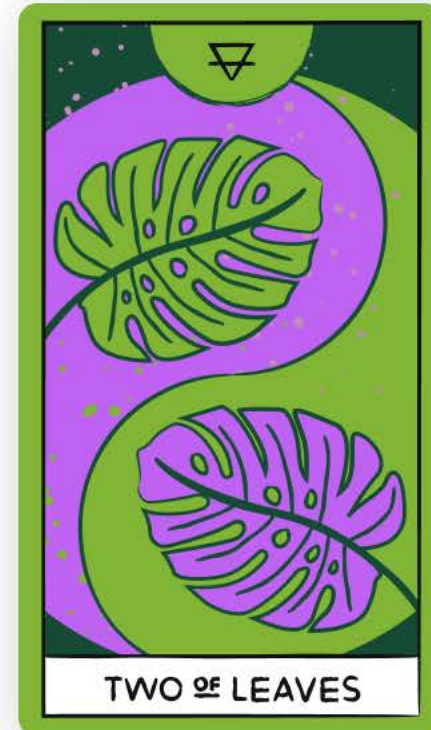

Two of Leaves
